

July 17 – Rudi Baumann, Tokyo to Vancouver Travelogue

Rudi, a charter member of our club, highlighted the trip that Sharon and he took in 2015. They flew nonstop from Denver to Tokyo on the recently instituted Boeing B-787 non-stop service. After touring Japan that included the tail end of the cherry blossom season, they boarded a ship to the Aleutians, Seward, and along the Inland Passage to their destination port, Vancouver. They stopped at several Alaskan ports on the way back that included Ketchikan.
