

10/21/19 - Molly McKinley, Bicycle Colorado

Oct. 28, 2019

Molly McKinley is with Bicycle Colorado, the statewide bicycle advocacy organization that leads a passionate and growing movement that champions the interests of everyone who rides or wants to ride a bicycle in our state. In her role as Community Safety Coordinator, she travels around Colorado educating both drivers and bicyclists on how to safely navigate our streets. These programs are designed to teach motorists and bicyclists how to use our streets safely together. The 1.5-hour, interactive courses cover laws for each road user, how to navigate on-street bicycle infrastructure and how to avoid common crashes between motorists and bicyclists. Auto-Friendly
