

### Snippets from Recent Club Programs

#### November 12 - Marc & Lili Bullion, Alert Dog Family

We heard the testimony of a young lady and her father about how the Foothills Kiwanis Club's Alert Dog Program is such a blessing to their family. Lily has a severe type of diabetes. Her father estimates that she has undergone 26,000 finger-pricks and probably lost two gallons of blood in the process of testing her sugar levels since she was 3-years old. The Foothills Kiwanis Club purchased Lily an Alert Dog whose name is Gismo. Gismo can detect when Lily's sugar level drops too low or elevates too high before her pancreatic monitor does. This happens because the human body emits a



different kind of bio-chemical scent when a person's sugar level drops too low or becomes too high. Six times during Lily's life, she experienced diabetic seizures that brought her to death's doorstep. Generally, she has no sense when her sugar level has dropped so low, but Gismo lets her know by getting her attention with barks and body language. Gismo is also able to retrieve her insulin and even bring orange juice to her when she needs it. Thanks, Lily, Gismo, and Marc, for a wonderful presentation to our members!

#### November 19 - Mike Fellows, 100th Anniversary of the End of WWI

Mike, a volunteer and past President of the Broomfield Veterans Memorial Museum, is a West Point graduate and served 26 years in the Army before retiring as a Colonel. He spoke to us about his wife's great grandfather, BG Michael Lenihan, USMA class, 1887. He participate in a vast breath of military experiences: served in the forts in the Montana and Nebraska territories, Spanish American War in Cuba, Philippine Insurrection, supported effort for the San Francisco Earthquake, and commanded two



different brigades in France during WWI. General Lenihan helped prepare our country for WWI, and later served in the war. Mike mentioned that war helped his wife's great grandfather's promotions: 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt. – 7 years, 1<sup>st</sup> Lt. – 5 years, Capt. – 12 years, Major – 5 years, Lt. Col. – 10 months, and Colonel – 3 months. He retired from military service in May 1929 and died in August 1958. Thanks, Mike, for interesting presentation, and tribute to a great hero!

Waverly served in New Guinea, the Philippines, and Japan from 1943 to 1945. The photo shows Waverly as a first sergeant in the 3257<sup>th</sup> Quartermaster Division in support of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Infantry. As a civilian, Waverly retired as Chief of the Earthquake Information Center in Golden, CO. Waverly was an Honor Flight recipient in 2016.



Gerald served in the US Navy from 1942 to 1944 as an Aviation Machinist and later as Flight Engineer on the PB2Y flying boats along the California coast. In 1944, he qualified for the V-12 program in the Engineering Department at the University of Colorado.
