

Capt. Dan spoke to us about The Salvation Army summer camps, in particular, High Peak Camp at Estes Park. The camp is nestled at the foot of the beautiful Rocky Mountains in Estes Park, Colorado. It is the gateway to the Rocky Mountain National Park, as well as many other tourist attractions. High Peak Camp and Conference Center is a Christian facility owned and operated by The Salvation Army, an evangelical branch of the Christian Church. Their mission is to use the elements of nature and the great outdoors as a setting to share the gospel of Jesus Christ. There are 55 SA camps in the US. These camps have hotel style lodges with chapels, meeting



rooms, amphitheaters, and sport fields. The camps are set up so that "a kid just gets to be a kid", and meals are set up to eat family style – something that many have not experienced. Matt Wittern professional communicator with experience sharing information with stakeholder groups some of the state's largest engineering civil and construction projects. He grew up in Broomfield and earned later undergraduate degree from Colorado State University. His current role at Denver



Water is as the Community Relations Liaison for the Gross Reservoir Expansion Project, which will help Denver Water increase water collection system resiliency and balance while providing environmental benefits for the state. He explained that population growth is 10,000 people per month, and the northern water collection system provides only 10% of Denver's water needs. Gross was built in 1950 with intent of a 131 foot raise to triple the reservoir size. The Two Forks lesson: work with the stakeholders!
