



# Snippets from Recent Club Programs

#### 1/27/20 - Jack Van Ens as Thomas Jefferson

Our 3rd President dropped in for a chat about constitutional and political history. Mr. Jefferson said our current divisiveness is not as virulent as in his era and recalled bitter battles among factions. He still has unkind words for Mr. Adams. Causes for such enmity? Perhaps high density, as a country of only 4 million (vs 330 million today) were crowded into thin strips of land along the coast. But, mostly owing to very different views on balance of gov't powers. The Federalists led by Mr. Hamilton at its extreme, feared anarchy and favored a very strong executive. The opposing faction, soon known as Democrat-Republicans (nothing like today's parties), feared tyranny and favored a stronger lower house — or "the people's voice." Each faction feared "mob rule" and, as such, had some favor for the



Senate, as a deliberative body: much longer terms and members not chosen by direct election (until 1913). The constitution is rather vague on this balance, and hence a tension has existed to this day.

#### 2/3/20 – Erick Mueller, CU Entrepreneurship

Erick Mueller, with the CU Business School, told us what it means to be an entrepreneur and described the mindset of an entrepreneur. He wants to empower his students and add to their business toolbelt. He provided lists of both positives and negatives of starting and running a business. He has helped businesses grow throughout his career. He started his career with DOT First Aid & Safety where he was promoted from a student intern to Vice President. He helped the organization grow from \$2.2 million in annual sales to over \$5 million in two years. Fresh from this experience, he founded Vision Co., a



corporate training and consulting organization. As CEO and President, he grew the business to over \$300,000 in annual revenue. In addition, Mueller is an award-winning Adjunct Professor and Director of the Cross-Campus Entrepreneurship Program at the Leeds School of Business at the University of Colorado Boulder, where he has been rated by students among the top MBA instructors.
