

## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

## June 7 – John Carlson, "Our United States Courts"

John Carlson, Assistant Federal Public Defender in the Denver federal courts, talked to our club about the structure and operation of our U.S. court system. He started by saying that there are two separate U.S. government court systems that can lead to the U.S. Supreme Court decisions: the federal-level U.S. District trial courts and U.S. Courts of Appeal; and the state-level District trial courts and appellate courts. There are 94 U.S. judicial districts; and 12 U.S. regional Circuit Courts of Appeal and a U.S. Bankruptcy Court. Colorado is in the 10<sup>th</sup> U.S. judicial district that also



covers six other states, where in 2009 this district handled 24,943 cases with a total of 41 judges. In contrast, the Colorado state-level courts handled an amazing 754,363 cases in 2009 with 381 judges. Our U.S. court system is kept impartial and fair by restrictions on judges' behavior and ruling when there's a conflict-of-interest. Although our U.S. court system is not perfect, it's a primary reason why continue to enjoy our many freedoms in the U.S.

### June 14 - Gordon Page, "Spirit of Flight Center" in Erie

Gordon Page (founder of the "Spirit of Flight Center" museum in Erie that has on display aviation items and artifacts of the past, present and future) told club members about his trip to Siberia in 1993 to find German World War II planes, followed by a trip to St. Petersburg that resulted in finding (and later bringing to Colorado) the Messerschmitt fighter plane flown by German ace Albert Brunner. Among other planes at the Sprit of Flight museum are a P-51 Mustang, a Hawker Hurricane, and the first jet-powered fighter in aviation history, the German Messerschmitt 262. Over 6500 people have

## <u>Foothills Provides Support for Boulder WWII Ball</u> -- Coordinator Bob Mohling

On Saturday evening, June 19, a 1940's "World War II Ball" was held at the Boulder Airport. We had 12 Kiwanians, spouses, and friends help with security and parking for the event, including (as shown below): Waverly Person, Fred McGehan, Mary Schweitzer, Audrey and Joe Girard, Jan and Dave Rogers, Janet and Jerry Gilland, Bob Mohling, and the Girard's neighborhood friends Dan and Kristie. Also shown below is Waverly (our club's only WWII veteran) standing in front of a Grumman "Avenger" WWII fighter.





The WWII Ball attendance last year was 500, but this year it jumped to an estimated 1200. Many wore costumes of the 1940's, and the music from that era was familiar and good. Aircraft on display included a British World War I Fighter SE5, a WWII BT13 "Vultee Valient" training plane, a Beech "Staggerwing" plane of WWII era, a Grumman "Avenger" that first appeared in the Battle of Midway, and the B-25 "Pacific Prowler" Mitchell Bomber. The Joe Peterson Dance Orchestra (a 10-piece "Glen Miller-type" big band) performed under the nose of the B25 Bomber. Also performing were The Andrews Sisters Singers and The Timberliners, a barbershop chorus.

Although the crowd was too large for the facility, all of our volunteers had a fun time at the WWI Ball on a beautiful Colorado evening. Thanks to all volunteers who helped make

this a memorable evening in remembering our armed services and the sacrifices that they made for us and our freedom.
