

Emily (Manager of High School Events for Colorado) spoke to our club about the "Junior Achievement" program that she coordinates for high schools in Boulder County, including Broomfield HS, Boulder HS, and Monarch HS. The mission of JA is to equip young people to own their future financial success, with educational materials available for all school levels (K-12). She spoke about the JA classes that are taught by volunteers at the request of regular school teachers, usually involving 5-7 sessions. Final Results for 2013 Foothills Kiwanis Salvation Army Bell-Ringing

Thanks for all who've volunteered for Salvation Army bell-ringing this past holiday season! The total collected by Foothills Kiwanis and non-Foothills volunteers from November 29-December 24 at our two sites was **§14,694.34**. This included \$9,075.47 collected at the Boulder 30th Street King Soopers; \$5252.49 at the Meadows Safeway; and \$376.38 on December 7 and 14 at the Louisville South Boulder Road King Soopers by Monarch High School Key Club members. Considering the very cold weather in early December and the short interval between Thanksgiving and Christmas, this was a great result!

The per-hour bell-ringing average for the Boulder 30th Street "Sunrise" King Soopers was \$59.71/hour; and for the Meadows Safeway, \$47.66/hour. The per-hour rate at the Louisville South Boulder Road King Soopers was only \$15.06/hour since we had as many as three Monarch students ringing at one time there. The grand total of volunteer hours by all our Foothills Kiwanis and non-Kiwanis bellringers was 287 hours. Leading Foothills Kiwanis bellringers this year are Bob Mohling and Kerry Hassler (25 hours); Mary Schweitzer (21 hours); Jerry Gilland, Greg Lefferdink, Adam Pauluhn, and Dave Rogers (8 hours) Leading non-Foothills bell-ringers were Laurance Hubbard (23 hours), Lynn Dyba (22 hours), Linda Beacher (16 hours), Arlene Devore (12 hours), and Hope Steffens-Nett (11 hours).. Update about Foothills Elementary K-Kids Activities

During the past year, the Foothill Elementary Community Service (K-Kids) Club has taken on a variety of projects. There have been activities of a local nature, such as support of the Bridge House boulderbridgehouse.org by making peanut butter and jelly sandwiches to be distributed to those in need, and also fleece scarves. The kids have also made fleece blankets to be given out via the Emergency Family Assistance Association (EFAA). Other activities with a local focus include promotion and collection of coats and winter clothing donations for the Rotary Coat Drive, and new or gently used toys for the Share-a-Gift program. They also are helping the school's PTO collect boxtops and other vouchers from products in each classroom (pictured is a project where they decorated tissue boxes)

On the regional level, the Foothills Elementary K-Kids raised \$60 with a bike wash at the fall bike rodeo to benefit Roundup River Ranch (www.roundupriverranch.org), and helped raise over \$1200 for the Leukemia and Lymphoma "Pennies for Patients" program.
